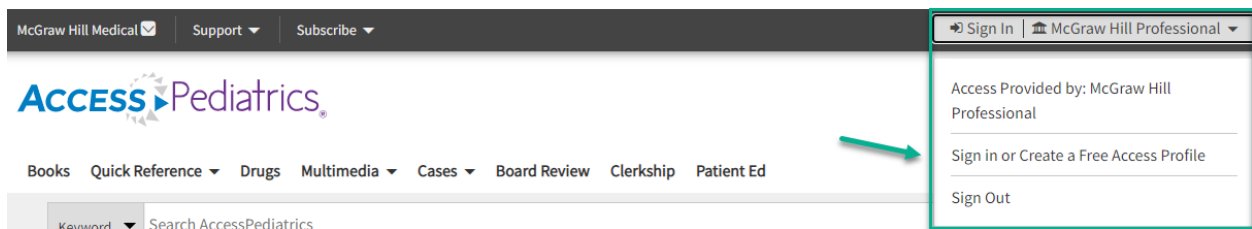



Searching

The search feature in **AccessPediatrics** is simple and easy to use. You can learn more about the search feature by [watching this tutorial](#) on the **Access User Center**.

Search Box

In **AccessPediatrics**, you can search for resources across all content types:

- Auto-suggest appears as you type (can be disabled)
- You can "phrase search" using quotations
- Get the same search results by combining terms together or by using **AND**
 - e.g., *asthma symptoms* = *asthma AND symptoms*

You can also search for a particular textbook by title, author or ISBN.

Search Builder

To the left of your search results, search builder allows you to:

- Focus the search by modifying your terms (keyword, title, author, ISBN)
- Filter results by format (chapter, tables, cases, images, multimedia, etc.)
- Select textbooks to see results by specific titles
- Narrow results by topics

Federated Search

A federated search expands your results from **AccessPediatrics** to include results from other McGraw Hill Access Medical sites:

- Click the "Search ... across all McGraw Hill Medical Sites" to run a federated search
- Search builder elements above apply

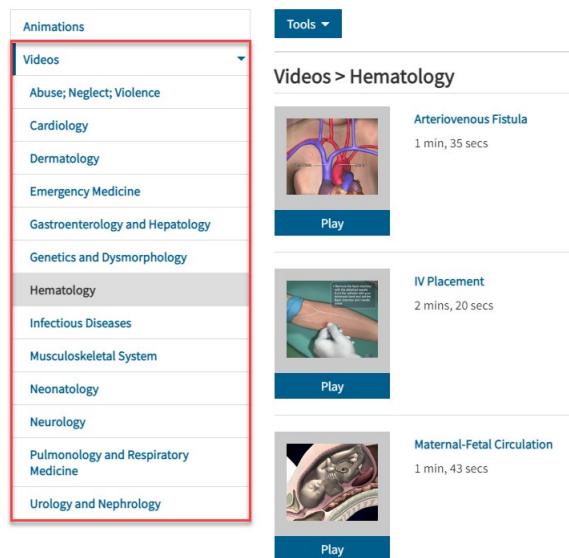
- Powered by Biodigital, these 3D **animations** offer an informative presentation of pediatric anatomy as well as particular conditions or diseases.

They vary slightly but for each case, you get a patient history and systems review, some short answer questions, clinical pearls, and references.

Cases are durable URL-enabled. Instructors can copy the browser URL and embed in an LMS to assign to students to complete. Cases include comprehension quizzes, and the results can be emailed, e.g., student to instructor.

Ankle Fracture

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KEY POINTS

- An ankle fracture is a break or crack in one or more of the bones in the ankle.
- Treatment may include surgery, a splint, cast, brace or special boot. Special exercises help your child's ankle get stronger and more flexible.
- Follow the full course of treatment your child's healthcare provider prescribes.

What is an ankle fracture?

An ankle fracture is a break or crack in one or more of the bones in the ankle. It may be just a bend or small crack in the bone, or the bone may break into pieces or shatter. Some fractures may stick out through the skin.

The bones in the ankle are the tibia, fibula, and talus.

What is the cause?

A broken ankle is usually caused by a twisting of the ankle. It may also be caused by a fall, a direct hit to the leg, or a medical condition that causes weak or brittle bones.
