3 Ways to Earn CME:

1. Through a structured point-of-care search in select **texts**

- In the “Books” tab, select “CME Eligible” to display all titles that are eligible for CME.

2. Through select **cases**

- Under the “Cases” tab select “CME Eligible”

3. Through select **review questions**.

- Under the “Review Questions” tab select “View All” and you will see “CME Eligible” in the lefthand Study Tools menu.

How to Claim CME:

1. By clicking on the **CME ribbon icon** in the chapter task bar or at the top of a case or completed Q&A, users can begin the process of claiming their CME credits.

2. For Books and Cases, users assign the content to a **Clinical Query**. Completed Review Questions may automatically populate in **“My CME.”** Users can navigate to the **“My CME”** page in their Access profile to organize and view credits and finish the process of claiming the credits.

CME eligible quizzes contain 20 questions and are random every time, so users do not have the ability to retake a previous quiz. To receive CME credit for the quiz, users must score at least 80 percent. **Each completed quiz is worth one AMA PRA Category 1 Credit.**

How to Claim CME (con't):

3. In “My CME” you will see Eligible Credits sitting in your queries, ”In Progress”, “Earned Credits” and you can learn more in About CME.

4. For CME Eligible Credits sitting in your query, simply select “**Earn CME Credit.**” This will take users to a brief **questionnaire**. This will ask general questions about the nature of the clinical query.

5. Once completed, the credits can be **claimed** immediately, or the credits can be saved for up to one year.
