

# Where can I find cases and study material suitable for residents?

Resident-level cases are located under the “Cases” tab on the toolbar of our Access sites.

Examples of resident-level cases include *Resident Readiness*, *Family Practice Board Review*, *Case Files Collection*, *Post-Graduate Cases*, and all cases found in the “Hospital Corner” tab on AccessMedicine
